The man had fallen and slid down while backcountry skiing. The man was already in a state of cardiopulmonary arrest on discovery, and death was confirmed after he was transported out. The cause of death was respiratory failure due to a broken neck.</p> <p>The man entered the mountain area of Rengedake on April 29th with 2 companions with the plan to stay 2 days and 1 night, and fell while descending the mountain on skis on April 30th.</p>
002	2016/3/26	2015/2016	2016/3/29	Hokkaido	M	41	<p>A male (41) company employee who went missing after being caught in an avalanche on March 26th, was discovered at the scene on March 28th at around 12:20 pm. He was transported to hospital in a state of cardiopulmonary arrest, where death was confirmed soon after.</p> <p>He was found in snow at a depth of approximately 5.5 meters. The cause of death was asphyxiation. The avalanche occurred before midday on March 26th, on the mountainside close to the 7th station. A search for the man continued from when he went missing after being caught in the avalanche while ski mountaineering.</p>
003	2016/3/21	2015/2016	2016/3/22	Hokkaido	M	21	<p>On March 21st at around 4:50 am, two male company employees who were mountaineering together with a male university student (21) notified a police station after descending from the mountain that the male university student was missing. The male university student was found by a helicopter at around 11:00 am on the same day, but death was confirmed shortly after he was transported to hospital.</p> <p>The 3 males entered the mountains in the morning of March 20th for ski mountaineering. In the mountains on the same day, 1 of the male company employees became separated from the group during a snow storm, and descended the mountain alone on the night of March 20th. The other male company employee bivouacked in the mountains with the male university student, but descended the mountain when he realized Mr. Uchiyama had lost consciousness. He met up the other company employee who had descended the mountain before him, then notified the police.</p>

The girl was riding the last inner tube in the line when she collided with a wooden post and suffered a severe head injury.

According to reports, the incident occurred at the end of a ski lesson, with a group of 14 fifth and sixth grade children including the girl skiing freely on beginner and intermediate ski slopes together with 2 instructors who were supervising them.

He had entered the mountain at around 10:00 pm on the same day by ski mountaineering to examine the condition of the snow, but had not returned by the scheduled time of descent off the mountain by 1:00 pm.

The man is believed to have fallen into the marsh while skiing, since he was still wearing ski boots.

The mountainside near the scene was frozen, and Mr. Sato was sliding down the mountainside on his side over the snow when he collided with the tree.

The 2 friends lost sight of Mr. Miyake who was snowboarding ahead of them, and so notified the patrol group of the ski resort.

There were no injuries indicating collision with a tree, and the police believe the male fell after deviating from the ski resort slope for an unknown reason.

The 2 men had entered a mountain forest not maintained by the ski resort with 3 companions, and were caught in the avalanche when they started skiing down a steep slope.</p>

With no external injury, the cause of death is believed to be hypothermia.</p>

He fell after losing control of his snowboard while snowboarding. He fell into fresh snow headfirst, and is believed to have been unable to breathe.</p>

There was no safety net in the vicinity of the scene.</p>

Approximately 90 middle school first graders were participating in the ski lesson at the time of the accident..</p> <p>There is no record of any previous major accident at the ski resort, and there were no safety nets to prevent people leaving the ski slope or cushions on trees. The condition of the ski slope in the afternoon of the same day was of compacted snow with almost no bumps, though slightly loose due to elevated temperatures.</p>
